Moments like this remind me of this memorable quote from Things Fall Apart, by the renowned African Author, Chinua Achebe "When we meet in a moonlit village, it is not the moon that brings us together, for each one of us can see it from his own compound. But we do so because it is good for kinsmen to be together". When kinsmen gather, they share. They share stories. Stories of their gains and pains. They share their hopes and plans. - 6. I wish to thank the Government of Austria, in particular, the kind-hearted and efficient officials from the Ministry of European and International Affairs. The ceremony this afternoon at the Hofburg Palace was conducted with the customary and renowned

Austrian elegance, class and efficiency! And it's that warm hospitality that I, together with my family, have enjoyed since we first landed at Vienna International Airport on the 31st of January this year.

- 7. I also wish to thank my colleague Ambassadors for the kind hospitality that you have extended to me since I first arrived. I have enjoyed forming new friendships and receiving your expert and professional guidance on matters both personal and professional. I am immensely grateful.
- 8. In our presence, we have representatives from the business sector including the Austrian Chamber of Commerce. I thank you for your attendance. It is my hope that in the course of my Tour of Duty, we will elevate the bilateral economic relations between our two nations to greater heights. Thank you for your sustained interest in working in and with Kenya.
- 9. Allow me to give special recognition to the Kenyan Diaspora in Austria represented here today by a few leaders and colleagues. It is a distinct honour to serve you. It is my aim is to create plenty of additional opportunities for meaningful and impactful engagements with you and to nurture a partnership that serves and supports your stay here in Austria while also enabling you to contribute to the growth of our country, Kenya.

I know I have many more people to thank but allow me to conclude this gratitude list by extending a note of sincere gratitude to the staff at the Embassy for their diligent efforts to make this day a success, their continued kindness to me and my family since we first arrived, and their continued dedication in the service of our nation. It is an honour to join this team.

Vienna's status as a hub for international diplomacy, in addition to the City's unique combination of historical significance, cultural vibrancy, commitment to sustainability, and strategic geographical location, among other attributes, creates the perfect conditions to seek solutions to the challenges of our time through the time-tested approaches of multilateralism and international cooperation.
- 13. It is my hope, as I join this community, that we shall be able to continue safeguarding the cherished ethos of the "Vienna Spirit" and contributing towards rules-based multilateral solutions to the challenges that face the world.

In my discussions today with His Excellency President van der Bellen, we spoke of the importance of using our platforms in Vienna to contribute towards finding solutions to the current global challenges, including ways of ensuring meaningful climate action, more shared prosperity and promoting peace and security in our regions.

While acknowledging the challenges of our time, we also spoke of the many opportunities which our diplomatic engagements can unlock, including ways of expanding our trade relations, opportunities for advancing our cultural exchanges, and ways of utilizing technological advancement to make the world a better place for all of us. For where there is a will, there is a way.
